Call for GM to control the weeds

THE terrible plight that serrated tussock presents to our local government area was discussed at last Tuesday's council meeting, with one councillor raising a motion to investigate an environmental levy specifically targeted at noxious weeds control.

In the preamble to his motion, Cr Geoff Kettle said noxious weeds in the local government area were out of con-

"It's been a slow insidious thing, exacerbated by the drought...to date little

has been done about it," he said. "If the out of con-trol noxious weeds are

not brought back under control they will destroy our farming landscapes within 10 years...then the problem will be 10 times more expensive to fix."

"Now is the time to start chemically controlling serrated tussock...we need our senior staff on board with the appropriate responsibilities of weed skill and

management," he said. General manager Chris Berry said

the council currently did this.

Cr Denzil Sturgiss added that the Goulburn Mulwaree shire had been

mapped for weeds.

But, not all councillors could support part of the original motion, which referred to transferring the weed con-trol from planning to the general man-

Cr Nina Dillon said: "if we start handing everything over to the general manager then where do we stop?"

The motion was re-introduced and

passed without this clause.

The final motion was that council: · Immediately increase the level of

wareness amongst landowners to the importance of controlling serrated tussock at this time of the year

• Directors within their departments be responsible for the control of noxious weeds within their land portfolios and include in their job arrangements key performance indicators of accountability on weeds control in line with private landowner responsibility and

accountability, and

• Initiate the immediate investigation of an environmental charge or levy specifically targeted at noxious weeds

After the meeting, member of the
NSW and ACT Serrated
Tussock Working Party
Stewart Thompson said he was disappointed they did not pin the responsibility onto a single person in coun-

"It is important that weed management becomes a pri-ority issue not just for council directors in their role as land managers but also the general manager of the coun-

cil," Mr Thompson said.
"His role is clearly defined within the Local Government Act as he is the only conduit between councillors and staff.

"The decision at the last council meeting to not bring noxious weeds management under his control is inconsistent with the coun-

cil's management structure and the legislative relationship between the general manager and councillors.

"The community needs confidence that there is a process and a chain of command within council that can help lead the community by demonstrating that there are workable plans in place in council and means of measuring them and the results."

Mr Thompson said the spread of serrated tussock has reached a scale not seen before, during the drought conditions of the last seven years.

He said serrated tussock covered

more than two million hectares of land southeast Australia and had the

potential to spread even further.

The NSW government cu The NSW government currently commits \$8.5 million annually to the noxious weeds campaign.
